## 3. PROFILE OF SKILLS AND COMPETENCES

#### A typical holder of the certificate is able to:

- breathe properly, as singing requires, with relaxed muscles and sing in a tone that is appropriate to the given piece of music, use her/his voice resonance to the maximum and stay perfectly in tune knowing the functioning of the human voice, and in particular the characteristic features of her/his voice and singing skills;
- do basic technical exercises as well as intonation and harmony exercises independently, and practice regularly and consciously;
- analyze pieces of music independently, and as she/he has developed her/his range of voice, breathing and singing technique and is able to control the organs involved in singing sing dynamically and fluently in the range that suits his/her singing voice, and use the various modes of phrasing;
- interpret musical styles of the various eras of music history appropriately, knowing the history and characteristic features of vocal music, and the composers and famous performers of the genre;
- perform the works of the most significant song, oratorio and opera composers in an authentic style, at a high artistic standard and in an emotionally expressive way, knowing the most important styles of vocal music as well as the works of the said composers;
- harmonise text and music, using her/his artistic imagination and performer skills;
- follow the tradition and customs of behaviour on stage, maintain contact with her/his audience and sing with a clear diction;
- perform pieces by heart (voice and piano) drawing on her/his trustable memory and concentration skills;
- read music in C clef and transpose into a new key (voice and piano, write as well);
- sight-read plain chants utilizing his/her music reading skills and independently perform the parts in chamber music;
- analyse pieces of music, and interpret each component individually as well as in its context in an adequate style;
- be familiar with the most important eras of music and art history drawing on her/his background knowledge about music and art history;
- compare the decisive events of music history and world history as she/he has a thorough background knowledge on the most significant eras in music history, their styles and characteristic features as well as the evolution of the typical forms and genres;
- cite excerpts of different musical styles by heart, recognise the pieces analysed and studied and their characteristic fragments, as well as their structural features and tonal peculiarities;
- be familiar with contemporary musical styles
- pursue ethno-musical studies, especially on the history of international folk music research and the folk music of other nations;
- perform in a clear and stylistic manner while properly applying the ornaments characteristic of Hungarian folk music in performing Hungarian pieces inspired by folk music;
- analyse folk songs using the appropriate technical terminology as regards their scale, tonal system, form, cadences, number of syllables per line, etc.

## Further information (including the description of the national grading method):

The basis of the grading system is a list of vocational and examination requirements compiled in accordance with uniform criteria and structure, issued in the form of legal regulation that includes the following:

- identification number and description of the vocational qualification as specified in OKJ and the relevant FEOR number,
- school and vocational prequalification required for the start of the training, aptitude and vocational competence requirements and prescribed practice,
- the most typical occupation or activity accessible to the holder of the vocational qualification certificate, the short job description, and the list of related vocational qualifications,
- the duration of the training required for the vocational qualification; maximum number of hours; the ratio of theoretical and practical training; the number of vocational training classes in the vocational training school; the duration of initial training period; the possibility of organising a grade examination assessing the efficiency of practical training,
- occupational requirements of vocational qualification,
- requirements pertaining to vocational examination.

The vocational and examination requirements will be classified by the occupational group committees of the National Qualification Register (OKJ) and by the National Council for Vocational Training, and subsequently they will be issued in the form of legal regulations.
