3. PROFILE OF SKILLS AND COMPETENCES

A typical holder of the certificate is able to:

- play music at high standard, using her/his artistic expressivity and knowledge of the various styles;
- play her/his instrument expressively, in a natural way and a wide dynamic range, use the proper body posture, hold the instrument properly and consciously use the proper breathing technique;
- play scales with variations, triads and seventh chords with arpeggios, intervals up to the fifth, chromatic and whole tone scales and augmented triads;
- start notes smoothly, quickly and aesthetically;
- play in a wide dynamic range;
- produce flageolet tones confidently;
- perform both solo and chamber music pieces as she/he has the necessary technical and musical skills;
- $\boldsymbol{\cdot}$ control the tension caused by playing on stage;
- concentrate for a longer period, which makes her/him able to play pieces by heart;
- play pieces accurately from notes in the appropriate style, with a sensible phrasing that reflects the logic of the given piece, memorise pieces reliably, play pieces by heart and play with a technique, imagination and phrasing that makes artistic expression possible using her/his background knowledge on the history and the most important composers and performers of her/his instrument, the works composed for it and the characteristic features of the Baroque, Classicist, Romantic, 20th century and contemporary music;
- contribute to the performance of technically and artistically demanding chamber music due to her/his refined ear, mastery and reliable sight reading skills:
- choose good reeds, regulate them and apply the basics of reed carving;
- use the relative and absolute system (read, take down, transpose, listening exercises, harmony exercises, analyses etc.);
- read music in C clef and transpose into a new key (singing, singing and playing the piano; writing as well);
- sight-read and independently sing parts in chamber music phrasing appropriately and staying in tune;
- sing in tune and perform polyphonic pieces by singing and playing the piano;
- analyse pieces, and interpret each component separately and in its context in the adequate style as she/he has background knowledge on the harmony, forms and styles of music;
- take down homophonic as well as polyphonic tunes by ear;
- sing and play pieces by heart (voice and piano);
- play the piano in an easy and natural way with a sensitive touch, sight play simple pieces (or transcriptions) fluently, play simple accompaniments at high standard and play works of different styles composed for the piano in an authentic style;
- play scales on the piano in keys from 7 # to 7 b, over 4 octaves with parallel and contrary motion, legato and non-legato, gradually speeding up the tempo, play common chord and seventh chord arpeggios (over 4 octaves as a passage as well), play tunes in octave parallel, chromatic scale, glissando and tremolo;
- be aware of the periods of music history, place composers in the appropriate period with a tolerance not exceeding fifty years;
- recognise the structural, stylistic and sound characteristics of unknown works and recognise known works after listening to short excerpts (several times) as well as use her/his knowledge in everyday practice;
- perform Hungarian works inspired by folk music in a clear and simple way and in the appropriate style, using the characteristic ornaments of Hungarian folk music:
- analyse folk songs, using the correct technical terminology, based on their scale, tonal system, form, cadences, number of syllables per line etc. and take down the draft of folk songs and simple instrumental melodies.

The basis of the grading system is a list of vocational and examination requirements compiled in accordance with uniform criteria and structure, issued in the form of legal regulation that includes the following:

- identification number and description of the vocational qualification as specified in OKJ and the relevant FEOR number,
- school and vocational prequalification required for the start of the training, aptitude and vocational competence requirements and prescribed practice,
- the most typical occupation or activity accessible to the holder of the vocational qualification certificate, the short job description, and the list of related vocational qualifications,
- the duration of the training required for the vocational qualification; maximum number of hours; the ratio of theoretical and practical training; the number of vocational training classes in the vocational training school; the duration of initial training period; the possibility of organising a grade examination assessing the efficiency of practical training,
- occupational requirements of vocational qualification,
- requirements pertaining to vocational examination.

The vocational and examination requirements will be classified by the occupational group committees of the National Qualification Register (OKJ) and by the National Council for Vocational Training, and subsequently they will be issued in the form of legal regulations.
