- appropriate communication and cooperation with trainers, physically disabled clients signing checking in or being in the familiarisation phase with the dog or those who have already taken the examination or receiving follow-up care;
- professional solution of the training control issues raised during follow-up care;
- comforting management of conflicts, if needed;
- apply modern dog training methods (clicker training, dummy training, halti, ignoring, distraction, rewarding and disciplining techniques, etc.) during the high-level socialisation, basic training and preparation for the development therapy work with dogs of different breeds and personalities.
