- the art conservation assistant performs the tasks of moving, packing, cleaning and conserving artworks under the professional supervision and guidance of a qualified conservator, and in compliance with museum legislation and art conservation standards;
- controls the condition and environment of artworks (climate conditions, hygiene) in the warehouse and on the exhibition site;
- reports to his/her supervisor in the case of conditions that deviate from the preventive conservation requirements;
- works in a dedicated and conscientious way to conserve and improve the condition of artworks, in compliance with the ethical rules of restoration;
- takes part in building and dismantling exhibitions and making installations;
- prepares professional, accurate, photographic documentation of the cleaning, conserving and restoring treatment of artworks, electronically and on paper if necessary;
- works in a team, in cooperation with professional museum staff;
- moves and packs various types of artworks (of ethnography, historical archaeology, natural history, fine arts, technical and industrial history) and performs their administration;
- documents the condition of artworks in photographs before, during, and after treatments;
- applies the laws, orders, and legislation concerning the operation and registration of museums and the protection of cultural property, as well as the rules on work, fire and accident protection.

WRITTEN EXAMINATION EXERCISES

In the exam, the examinee must answer a set of centrally compiled questions. Subjects: - The place, task and role of the museum in the transfer of culture, the basic forms and most important rules of Hungarian museum activity. - Hungarian museum history, art collection and Hungarian museum legislation - Registration and administrative and service activities taking place in museums and their rules - Environmental factors influencing works of art and their effects, preventive art conservation - Museum safety, work, fire and accident protection - The main characteristics of Asian and European hand-dipped and machine-made papers, the causes, types and characteristics of paper damage, the main methods, materials and risks of cleaning and repairing paper. - Steps of leather preparation, types of tanning, main properties of tanned leather and parchment and causes and forms of damage, methods, materials and risks of cleaning and gluing leather. - The main characteristics of natural and artificial fiber materials and types of textiles, the causes and main forms of damage to textiles, operations prior to wet cleaning and the risks of wet treatment, rules for sewing conservation. - Parts of the tree and the main properties of wood, wood pests and their main forms of appearance, the materials, methods and risks of dry and wet cleaning of wood, the materials and main ethical aspects of wood gluing. - The main physical and chemical properties of iron, copper and tin, their damage, the differences between various corrosion products, patina and surface contamination, the various possibilities and risks of their removal, surface protection materials. -The concept of ceramics, its main types, the composition of raw materials and basic production techniques, the causes and forms of typical damage in the case of archaeological and non-archaeological ceramic objects, the theoretical basis for the treatment of these types of damage, risks of interventions.

PROJECT EXERCISES

Examination part a): Presentation of the examination task (conservation and restoration of an work of art selected by the teacher under the guidance of the teacher). The examination paper must include the following chapters: Data and description of the subject Historical background Production technique description, condition assessment, material tests, conservation-restoration plan, conservation - restoration process, suggestions for further treatment of the object, materials used, figure and list of pictures, bibliography. The thesis must also include photographs of the subject and work processes. The examinee submits the paper graded by the specialist teacher to the accredited examination centre prior to the date of the examination, and the conserved-restored work of art must be presented on-site on the day of the examination. In the course of the examination, the candidate presents the main parts of the thesis and work. The committee inspects the treated object and asks questions about the treatment. Examination part b): Packaging of a chosen "work of art". The examinee packages the object designated by the committee for rental

Examination part b): Packaging of a chosen "work of art". The examinee packages the object designated by the committee for rental purposes in accordance with the regulations for the protection of works of art, by selecting the most appropriate of the available packaging materials. Finally, the movement of the object is recorded in the simulated movement diary including a proposal for the ideal climatic conditions of the work of art.
